

MOUNT ST. HELENS INSTITUTE Field Camp Host

Position: Field Camp Host | Part Time

Compensation: \$17/hour depending on experience

Term of Employment: July 6, 2021 – September 9, 2021 (some flexibility). Not to exceed 310 hours.

This is a part-time, non-exempt, temporary seasonal position.

Closing Date: April 4th, 2021

SUMMARY:

The Mount St. Helens Institute seeks a part-time Field Camp Host for the 2021 summer season. We desire candidates who are passionate about providing excellent customer service, cooking gourmet food for 12 people, and working in a remote outdoor kitchen.

The groups hosted will be diverse, including our Into the Crater Hike participants, international groups of scientists, and possible additional programs. Providing a welcoming and inclusive environment is key.

Hosting will take place at our Field Camp near Windy Ridge - an established, remote camp on the east side of Mount St. Helens. It includes a fully stocked outdoor kitchen, canvas wall tents with wood stoves, fire pit, and composting toilet- all with views of Mount St. Helens, Mt. Rainier, and Mt. Hood. The kitchen is set up under a open air tent with a three-burner propane stove, propane grill, and a shipping container for food and supply storage. There is no running water, and all water is brought in. We have a standing sink, buckets, and sump area for water disposal. The Field Camp Host may share a staff-only canvas wall tent.

Field Camp Host can expect to work Friday through Sunday throughout the summer with some weekday work. Field Camp Host will work under the supervision of the Outdoor Programs Manager. See guided program descriptions here. See Field Camp site photos here.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Host groups at our Windy Ridge Field Camp; welcoming, site tours, cook, serve
- Plan meals for all hosted meals, with support from the Outdoor Program Manager
- Shop for meal ingredients the day before the trip
- Organize and transport water and food
- Prepare gourmet meals for groups up to 20 people
- Maintain supplies and equipment
- Clean cookware and dishes after meals
- Close camp after each trip; sweeping, tidying, organizing
- Follow all health procedures
- Other duties as assigned

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Passion for customer service and hosting groups
- Experience cooking for groups up to 12+ people
- Excellent people and group management skills
- Ability to work both independently and in groups in remote areas with minimal supervision
- Enthusiasm for Mount St. Helens and the mission of the Mount St. Helens Institute
- Have a valid driver's license with an acceptable driving record for the past three years
- Have a reliable personal vehicle

ABILITIES: Hosting requires the ability to lift up to 60 lbs., stand and cook on uneven ground, bend and twist. Regular driving for up to 4 hours is common.

WORKING HOURS: This is a part-time position with mandatory paid trainings. The typical schedule will be Friday-Sunday. Some days will be longer than 10 hours; some days host will be off during for 8 hours in the middle of the day in a remote location; host will camp overnight without pay. The schedule will vary based on program dates but the schedule will be announced at minimum of 2 weeks in advance. Most trips are on the weekends, though some weekday work will be required.

LOCATION: The Mount St. Helens Institute's main office is in Amboy, WA. Hosting will occur at our Field Camp near Windy Ridge on the east side of Mount St. Helens.

ABOUT US: MSHI is a non-profit organization dedicated to advancing understanding and stewardship of the Earth through science, education and exploration of volcanic landscapes. MSHI functions as a tight-knit group of individuals united in our common passion for Mount St. Helens. We value diversity, good challenges, adventure, fun, partnership and community.
